SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1. ORGANIZATION

The 21st Annual SOL Female Cross Country Classic is organized SOL and the Belize Cycling Association under the regulations of the International Cycling Union and BCA. It is to be held on Sunday 16th May, 2010. The race will start at the Columbus Park in San Ignacio at 8:30 a.m. travel to Belize City to finish at the Memorial Park for 70 miles .

ARTICLE 2. TYPE OF EVENT

The event is open to athletes of the Women Category. The event is entered on the BCA calendar.

The event is registered as a class HC event. In conformity with the UCI rules, points are awarded as follows:

ARTICLE 3. PARTICIPATION

This event is open to individual riders.

ARTICLE 4. RACE HEADQUARTERS

The race headquarters of the race shall be open starting, Monday 3rd May, 2010 and located at : 7202 Caesar Ridge Road, Belize City at which riders ***are requested to submit their starters.***

Riders will collect their race numbers at the Technical Meeting on Friday May 14th – 7:00 p.m. at the Olympic Committee Conference Room, Albert Street .

Race Headquarters on the arrival site shall be open at 6:30 a.m. and located at the Columbus Park in San Ignacio.

ARTICLE 5. RADIO TOUR

Race information will be broadcast on the following frequency: 88.5.

ARTICLE 6. NEUTRAL TECHNICAL SUPPORT

The technical support service handle by Belize Cycling Association and SOL Belize. Driver Mr: Bruce Vergo, Mechanics: Messrs: Dillon Murray, John Vergo and Cleon Broaster. The neutral support is taken care of by means of 1 pickup truck providing wheel, and water.

ARTICLE 7. FEEDING ZONE

The feeding zone will be closed from the start of the event until the first 31 miles; however, riders will be allowed to drop back to their vehicle for refreshments after the first 15 miles. The zone will be opened after the completion of the first 30 miles into the race and will be closed at Mile 10.

ARTICLE 8. FINISHING TIME LIMITS.

Any rider finishing in a time exceeding that of the winner by more than 30 minutes shall not be placed.

ARTICLE 10. AWARDS CEREMONY

1.2.112 All riders concerned shall, in accordance with their placing, classifications and performances, participate in official ceremonies such as the presentation of jerseys, bouquets or medals, laps of honour, press conference and the like.

1.2.113 Unless otherwise stated, riders shall appear at official ceremonies wearing competition clothing.

In accordance with article 1.2.112 of the UCI rules, the following riders **must** attend the official awards ceremony:

- The first 3 of the event

The riders will present themselves at the podium in a time limit of maximum 1 hour after crossing the finish line.

ARTICLE 12. PENALTIES

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable. (For other events).
